### **FECRPD Forms Citizens' Oversight Committee for Measure Q Spending**

*Voter-approved bond provides \$24 million for District improvements and repairs*

Sacramento, Calif. – The Board of Directors for the Fulton-El Camino Recreation and Park District (FECRPD) has selected eight community members to serve on a new Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee to review spending from Measure Q, the \$24 million bond approved by District voters in November 2024.

“We are thankful to our community members for volunteering to serve in this important role,” said Board Chair Teresa Mironchik Higgins. “Measure Q represents a historic investment from our community to improve our parks and facilities. We are committed to maximizing these funds through transparent and accountable spending, with the active involvement of the oversight committee.”

Community members were invited to apply for the committee through an open call for applications. Seven members and one alternate were selected and approved by the Board during its April 17 meeting. Members will represent various community perspectives.
