5. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND DIRECTION

5.1 Selection of Special District Commissioner and Alternate Commissioner to Serve on Sacramento Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo)

A). Candidates Comments

Ted Costa gave the Board more of his qualifications and stated that he is running for LAFCo and not against anyone.

Gay Jones spoke to the Board via Zoom and requested continued support from the district. She has 16 years of experience with LAFCo and believes decision should be made on what serves the public interest.

Charlea Moore then addressed the Board and informed them she is running for the alternate commissioner position. She believes Special Districts are important to the government and those above the Special Districts do not have any concept of what they do. She asked for the Board's vote.

B). Board to vote for One (1) Commissioner and One (1) Alternate Commissioner for the LAFCo election.

Chair Seaman thanked everyone who spoke and felt that it showed the importance of Special District's like ours.

Chair Seaman nominated Gay Jones to received the vote for Special District Commissioner from

FEC, and Vice Chair Stricklin seconded the motion. Motion passed on a 5-0-0-0, with no Nays or Abstentions.

For the Alternate Commissioner, Secretary Lavallee nominated Charlea Moore and Director Dias seconded the motion. Motion passed on a 5-0-0-0, with no Nays or Abstentions.

5.2 Bohemian Park Expansion Project

Marco Lemes, Project Manager for SMUD spoke regarding a Mobility HUB that SMUD is interested in bringing to Bohemian Park as part of their goal to be zero carbon emission by 2030 and to bring electric transportation to underserved communities. He explained what mobility Hubs were and what they could bring to the communities. SMUD wants to be involved in some way with Bohemians' Master Plan.

General Manager Ballus thanked Mr. Lemes for his presentation. She informed the board that she wants to gather all the pieces we might have and then gather everyone to plan. Chair Seaman reported that the GM Ballus has been working hard on this project and he feels that perhaps we need to set up and Adhoc committee. It would have a short horizon, perhaps next spring. The committee would send their recommendation to the facilities committee. It was decided that the Bohemian Park Development Adhoc committee would consist of Chair Seaman and Vice Chair Stricklin with General Manager Ballus.

5.3: New Brown Act Amendment Rules Changes for Teleconference Meetings During A State of Emergency

If we would like to continue zooming board meeting, we would need a resolution every month with the resolution sunsetting in 2024. Chair Seaman said it was part of the CARPD discussion in the meeting he attended earlier in the day.

General Manager informed the Board that the county has extended the mask mandate indefinitely. The district put in a request close to 750K from the Coivd-19 relief fund.
